No. Do you smoke or drink alcohol? I used to smoke. How many years did you drink alcohol, and how many years have you stopped? Doctor, does anyone in your family have heart disease or diabetes? My father had heart disease, and my mother has diabetes. Are you allergic to any medications or foods? I don't know if I have any allergies. What medications are you currently taking? I take aspirin, atorvastatin, and metoprolol. How are you? Thank you very much. Doctor, I'll examine you for a moment. Physical examination. Your blood pressure is 136, 84, pulse 88, respiratory rate 20, and blood oxygen 95%. Your legs are swollen, and the lungs have a slight abnormal sound. Doctor, I'll send you for further tests. After receiving the test results. You are coming. Electrocardiogram. The X-ray of the lungs and the ultrasound of the heart, echo, shows that your heart function has decreased. The ejection fraction is around 35%, indicating that the heart pumps less blood than normal. Patient: It sounds scary, is this dangerous? This is called heart failure, which is caused by weak heart muscles, which may result from a previous heart attack, but don't worry too much because it can be treated and controlled with medication and behavioral adjustments. Patient, and what do I need to do? Doctor will prescribe a diuretic called furosemide.
